Come visit downtown Hyannis and see the many opportunities and happenings on Main Street!




Hyannis: Capital of the Cape

Unlike the Cape's other well-known towns, Hyannis is both geographically central as well as economically diversified; a popular summer destination as well as a year-round community.

The town of Barnstable is the largest community in Barnstable County, which is roughly conterminous with what is more commonly known as Cape Cod.

The Village Center of Hyannis

Hyannis Main Street is a walkable, "seven block" street with a diversified mix of retail shops and restaurants that appeal to a wide range of clientele. It is also just five minutes away from Hyannis Harbor on foot.

*Walk Score, a subsidiary of Redfin, provides a measure of the "walkability" of a given location, as based on the number of services and amenities not requiring the use of a car. It uses a 0 to 100 scale, with a score between 90 and 100 representing a "Walker's Paradise."

Cape Cod, one of the East Coast's premier vacation destinations, welcomes more than **6,000,000** visitors per year.

According to 2018 surveys of (off-Cape) New England residents, Hyannis enjoys the second-highest name recognition among all the towns on the Cape, slightly behind Provincetown.





Vacationers as Shoppers

Not pressed for time, oriented toward convenience or fixated on price, vacationers are primed to spend and ready to buy on impulse. More than three-fourths make a purchase during their visit to Hyannis Main Street; more than half on either clothing or souvenirs.

With the famed Kennedy Compound in nearby Hyannis Port, Main Street boasts the John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum, attracting 69,000 visitors in 2018, 25% of these vistors international.



Hyannis Harbor is the port for Hy-Line Cruises' high-speed ferries to Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard. It is also the Cape's largest recreational boating port. Year-Round Demand

Unlike the Cape's other village centers, Downtown Hyannis attracts both a seasonal trade and a year-round customer base.

The Town of Barnstable, by far the largest on the Cape, expanded by

8.2% in the 2010s, to 49,000 residents.

As the "Capital of the Cape," Downtown Hyannis is also the center of gravity for a county of 230,000 year-round residents.

HYBRID/REMOTE WORK AND HYANNIS

With Boston/Cambridge just a 1.5-hour drive away, Hyannis is expected to benefit from the shift to hybrid/remote work, with a greater number of year-round and second-home residents as well as summer visitors arriving earlier (May/June) and/or staying later (September/October).

Hub of Cape Cod

The Best Regional Access of the Cape's Major Village Centers...

- Connects to two interchanges along US Route 6, the Cape's only limited access highway.
- Runs a mile south of MA Route 28, the main east-west artery along the Cape's southern half.
- Sits a mile away from Cape Cod Gateway Airport, the Cape's main commercial airport.
- Home to the Hyannis Transportation Center, the Cape's main depot for intercity train and bus service.





Parking: *Not* a Problem in Downtown Hyannis

According to a 2017 Nelson-Nygaard study, even in the most in-demand locations, at the busiest times of day and during peak tourist season, there is more than enough supply.

Getting to Yes

Among Cape Cod towns, the Town of Barnstable is known for a "Getting to Yes" approach that aims to expedite approvals and permitting.

Once here, businesses are represented and supported by the Hyannis Main Street Business Improvement District (BID), which takes the lead on advocacy, marketing and promotions, events and beautification while also assisting with retail attraction.
